

March 22, 2016

WHEREAS, the Township received a scope of work and fee estimate dated March 10, 2016 from Maser Consulting P.A. entitled the 2016 Roadway Improvement Program Phases I & II to provide award notices, contract document preparation, construction support services, required documentation to NJDOT for Washington Avenue and same to Community Development for Tuxedo Place and preparation of all payments and change orders to contractors for a fee not-to-exceed \$224,500.00; and

WHEREAS, funds are available in Capital Ordinance 5349 to compensate the person or firm selected to advise the Governing Body in connection with the foregoing; and

WHEREAS, the availability of said funds has been certified by the Local Finance Officer in account C-04-55-534-999; and

WHEREAS, the Local Public Contracts Law (N.J.S.A. 40a:11-1) et. Seq. requires that the Resolution authorizing the award of Contracts for "Professional Services" without competitive bids must be available for public inspection.

Mr. Prather would like to see all the Veteran's groups get together and set up programs geared for veteran's families who need help and also veterans needing help.

Mr. Prather stated we should all remember "Veterans make America great".
