

April 24, 2018

The Township Committee of the Township of Union in the County of Union, convened in regular session at Municipal Headquarters, Friberger Park, Union, New Jersey, on the 24th day of April, 2018 at 7:30 P.M. The meeting was called to order by Suzette Cavadas, Chairwoman of the Township Committee.

MR. FIGUERIEDO:

- Mr. Figueiredo congratulated both fine young officers who were promoted to Sergeant tonight.
- Mr. Figueiredo thanked Committeewoman Delisfort and the ADA Committee on the successful event last night. Mr. Figueiredo also thanked Ignacio Pinho, owner of O'Lagar for being a wonderful host.

- Mr. Figueiredo spoke about the Clean up the Waterways event and how it was a successful event.
- Mr. Figueiredo presented the monthly report from the Fire Department.

MR. FLORIO:

- Mr. Florio congratulated Sergeant Lagoa and Sergeant Jovic on their promotions.
- Mr. Florio presented the monthly report from the Police Department.
- Mr. Florio stated that there was work being done on Route 22 West, and strongly suggested that residents avoid the area until work is completed.
- Mr. Florio spoke about Clean up the Waterways event.
- Mr. Florio spoke about the Police Park and Walk program.
- Mr. Florio spoke about the resolution introducing wifi to the Union Center area as part of the Stuyvesant Avenue Redevelopment.
- Mr. Florio was encouraged to report that the Seabra project on Stuyvesant Avenue was at full capacity with all rental units rented.

MS. CAVADAS:

- Ms. Cavadas congratulated Sergeant Lagoa and Sergeant Jovic.
- Ms. Cavadas presented the monthly Department of Public Works Report.
- Ms. Cavadas invited all residents to attend the Inflatable Race Event and Food Truck Festival scheduled for May 12.

PUBLIC HEARING:

Mike Giaimo, 680 Fairway Drive, President of the Fairway Drive Civic Association, spoke about Fairway Drive East and Fairway Drive South (the “green way”). He spoke about how there is more traffic, pedestrians, skateboarders, bikers, joggers, etc., but there are no sidewalks, making it unsafe for the residents.

Mr. Manzella stated that our engineering department has been in touch with both County and State offices with these concerns. He explained that the Township has limited control over these roads.

Ms. Cavadas asked the Township Engineer, Joe Venezia, to come up and update the residents.

Mr. Venezia stated the plans for the area and that the county is currently going to re-pave within the existing limits. Mr. Manzella asked Mr. Venezia to meet with whomever funds the Greenway project and stress the safety concerns of our residents. Mr. Venezia agreed to do so.

David Weisbrod, 990 Tinkettle Turn, spoke about his concern with the amount of illegal U-turns on Fairway Drive. He suggested that the Committee speak with the County regarding putting a rise there that would prevent cars/trucks from making illegal U-turns.

Robert Marshall, 656 Fairway Drive, spoke about issues of children, adults, bikes, etc. crossing the intersection where Fairway Drive South, Fairway Drive East and Route 22 come together. It is a dangerous area. He asked if the Township would please address the issue. Mr. Manzella stated that he would have traffic bureau look into it, but that it was a State Highway and County Road.

Mr. Giaimo spoke again about the last snow storm when they closed Route 22 due to flooding and traffic was being let off on Fairway Drive and trucks were making U-turns and some private property was destroyed.
