Mr. Antonelli, Mayor Cavadas and Mr. Manzella all responded to his questions.

There being no further business presented, the Township Committee on motion of Mr. Figueiredo, seconded by Ms. Delisfort, and carried, adjourned the meeting, the time being 9:04 P.M.
